...whilst Art Town sessions for ages 5 – 18 years in Houghton Regis moved online, with activity packs delivered to the doors of participants for weekly Zoom sessions led by local artists, including spoken word, puppetry, dance, crafts and more.







In February we visited residents of Bedford Prison to talk about their experiences as parents, and modern prison life. How lucky we were then in March to welcome nearly 500 of Bedford's school children to the John Bunyan Museum for our interactive experience Pulpits and Prison Doors, giving children the opportunity to learn all about the life of Bedford's most famous prisoner John Bunyan and his book A Pilgrim's Progress.



At our flagship festival Luton's Full House Feb Fest in February, 1,666 children and their grown-ups attended shows and took part in creative activities across Luton. We also welcomed delegates from national and local venues to see what the Feb Fest fun is all about.





Houghton Regis families came together in September for our outdoor festival Hullabaloo to enjoy Circo Rum Ba Ba's circus theatre show 'L'Hotel and take part in a range of creative activities with workshops run by local artists. To close the event, Art Town participants came together for a community picnic with special guests The Bugs.





We continue to listen to the needs of our COMMUNITY, participants and audiences, as well as the VOICES of our sector.


In January, we welcomed Destine Lord to our team as Diversity and Inclusion Associate.
