

# Snail Trail

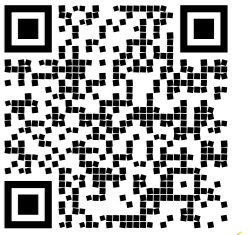
AMPTHILL GREAT PARK 2026

Welcome to **The Snail Trail**. A Full House Theatre collaboration led by local artist Ross Bolwell-Williams on behalf of Ampthill Town Council.

Use this map to find one of Ampthill Great Park's most elusive residents – the snail! Each of the 12 colourful snails was imagined and designed by Year 3 pupils from The Firs Lower School. Each one is bold, vibrant and completely unique. Enjoy discovering them all!

You can explore on your own, or use the free **What3Words** app (or website) to help. All the snails can be located in the **trees** in the **wooded area** opposite The Coffee Lodge.

What3Words



Each snail's location is made up of three words (see the list below). You will need to type in these words (with a **full stop** in between each word with no spaces).

# MAKE YOUR OWN Snail



Now that you have completed  
THE SNAIL TRAIL, you can make your  
very own unique snail design at home.

## YOU WILL NEED...

- Scissors
- Colouring Equipment  
(Felt tip pens, colouring pencils, crayons etc.)
- Glue Stick

## STEP BY STEP GUIDE

- Use the scissors and follow the outline to cut out the 6 snail shapes
- Use your colouring equipment to make your own unique bold design onto each snail shape
- Stack your shapes from biggest to smallest
- Once you are happy with the placement, add a layer of glue onto each underside
- Once your snails are complete, place them somewhere in your home to create your very own art trail.



## TOP TIP!

After cutting out the shapes, you can use them as a template to create more snails.
